<b>Duties:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Perform radio dispatch duties for police, EMS, and fire units; dispatches other city units after hours and on weekends;</li> <li>• Receives and routes incoming telephone calls;</li> <li>• Monitors fire and burglar alarms;</li> <li>• Sound civil defense sirens as directed from appropriate authority;</li> <li>• Make inquiries, entries, modifications and cancellations into the NCIC/TCIC computer as requested;</li> <li>• Assists as necessary with the collection of fines, fees, and bonds;</li> <li>• Performs recording keeping duties;</li> <li>• Performs other dispatch related duties as required.</li> <li>• Responsible to do periodic checks of prisoners to include feeding and dispensing medications.</li> <li>• Inclusive of the duties listed above, duties will also include that of a 911 operator, and other duties as directed/assigned</li> </ul>

<b>Requirements:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Must be of good moral character as determined by a thorough background investigation;</li> <li>• Must be able to work twelve hour shifts, weekends, and holidays when assigned;</li> <li>• Must be willing to wear a uniform;</li> <li>• Must demonstrate the ability to exercise good judgement under stressful conditions;</li> <li>• Must have an acceptable "radio voice."</li> <li>• Must be able to read, write, speak, and understand the English language fluently.</li> <li>• Must have the ability to type a minimum of 30 words per minute.</li> <li>• Must have the ability to pass an online typing test, written test, and practical exercise.</li> </ul>
